The original railroad station, also a reked hotel on some maps, is a two and one-half story, irregular, six bay, multi-gabled, structure. Original door on west facade with paired, round-topped window. Wraparound porch with railing and turned posts.  "The original station was the building that is now Mans and Katy's Restaurant.
