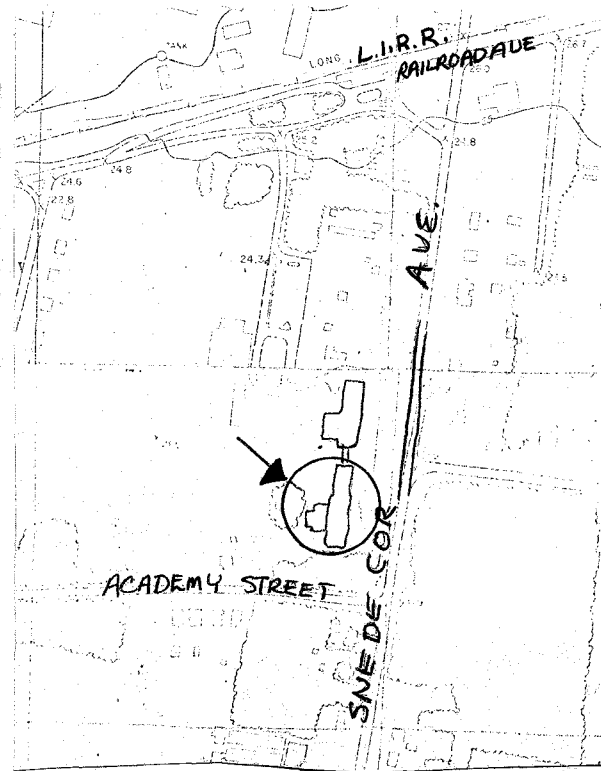

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, brick structure of seven pilastered bays with flanking units of banked windows. All under an unbroken hip roof with cupola. Brownstone water table above high brick base. Brownstone spandrels between first and second floor windows. Brownstone capitals on pilasters. Pedimented brownstone entrance with arch-topped doors. 1/1 mullioned windows with transoms.

Built in 1927, and designed by Wilson Potter, architect, according to plaque inside front entrance.
