20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story irregular structure with a gable roof. Formerly a turkey house, it is completely covered with scalloped shingles except for peak over front door on east facade and on dormers. North gable also has inverted scalloped shingles. One story, shed roof extension on south Oculus windows in north and south gables. Judge Marvin Manton, son-in-law of J.H. Stoppani ran this turkey house. He was a Judge of the New York State Supreme Court. It is marked on the 1915 Atlas at which time Meadow Lane was not cut through between Ocean and Fairview Avenues.
