According to Stevenson, But As Yesterday, Myers owned this watil c. 1874 when it was bought by the McConnell family . In 1875 they moved out and gave it to St. Ann's Church for a rectory. In 1917 it was moved to its present location.

Two and one-half story, two bay, gable roof, L-shaped, cottage with gable end to the street. Queen Anne details and Queen Anne window in peak. Decorative stick work in peak. Original porch with turned posts. 6/2 windows.
