20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, three bay, side entrance, clapboard house. Original wraparound porch with turned posts and decorative spandrels with sawn holes. 2/2 windows. Brick foundation. Two original corbelled chimneys. Typical Queen Anne window in gables. Blind window on east.

According to Stevenson's history, the house was built in 1880 by George Morris. In 1915 O.F. Smith owned it.
