20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, three bay, gable roof, clapboard house with gable end to street, and matching cross-bays. Original porches with sawn spandrels, turned posts, sawn balusters and infill all intact. 1/1 windows. Brick foundation. Two original corbelled chimneys. Typical Queen Anne front door. Round-headed window with drops in front peak.

According to owner, this house was built c. 1883 by Henry Weeks. It belonged to Estate of Mrs. Winter in 1915.
