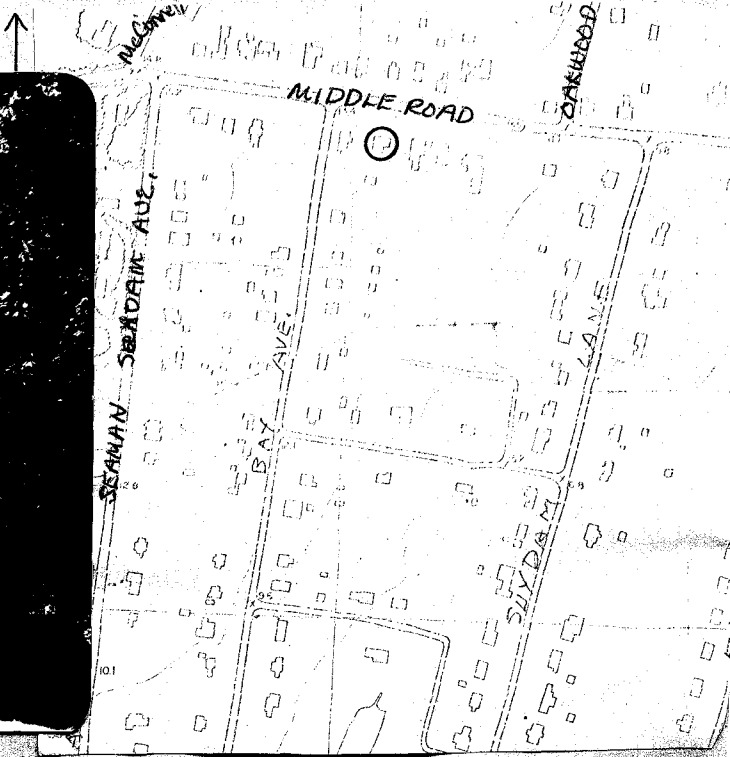
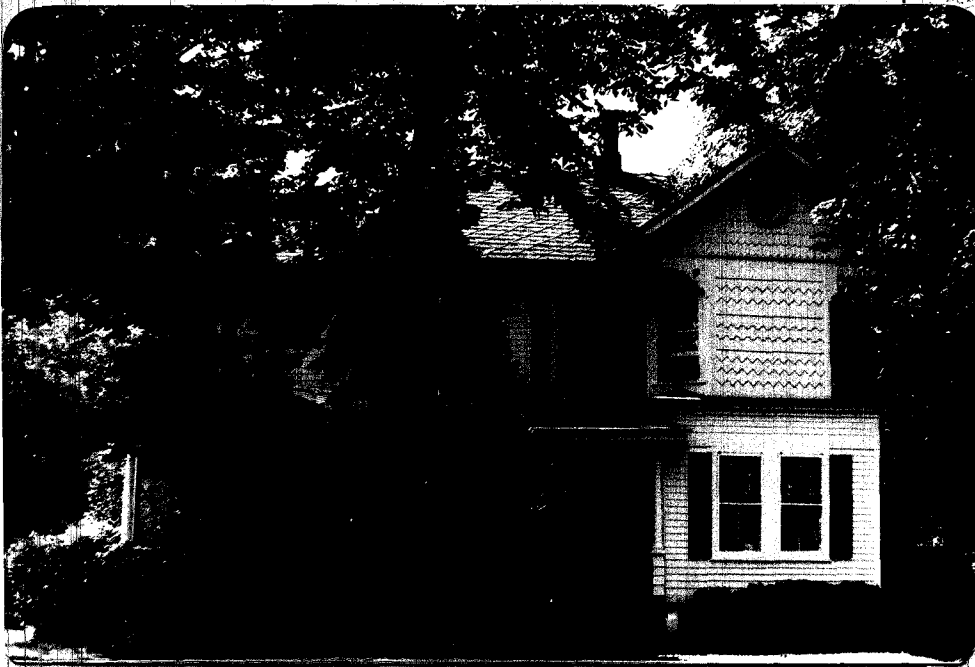

Scalloped shingles at third floor level on all sides including gables. Garage gable matches. Unevenly-spaced panes in upper sash over two panes in lower sash. Interesting porch with projecting pavillion. Brick foundation. House belonged to A hby in 1915.**
