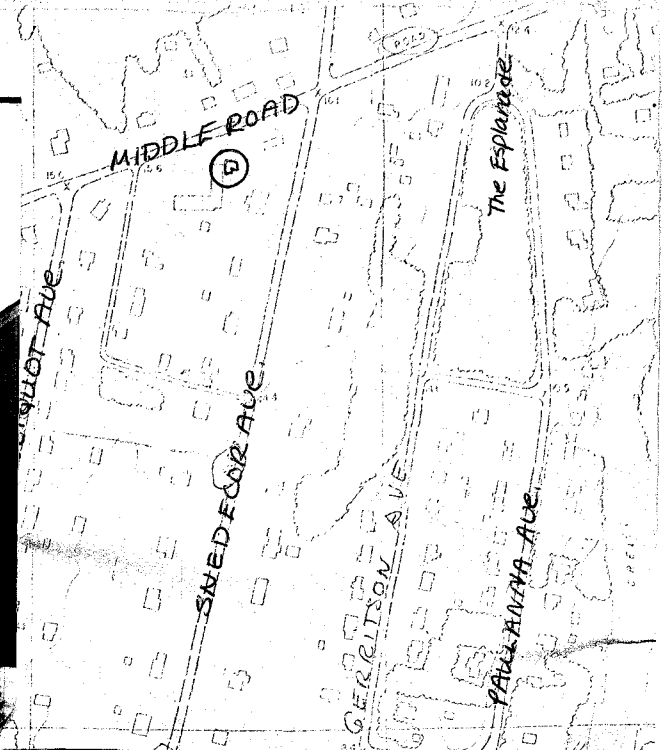

It was built by the contractors Ashby and Breckenridge, according to a news clipping of 1977.*
