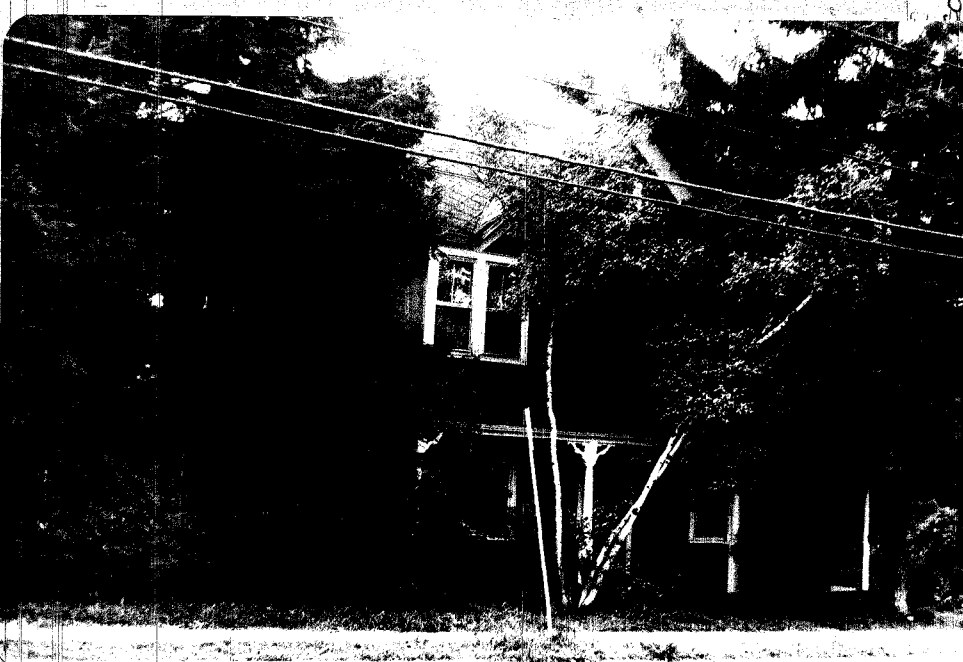
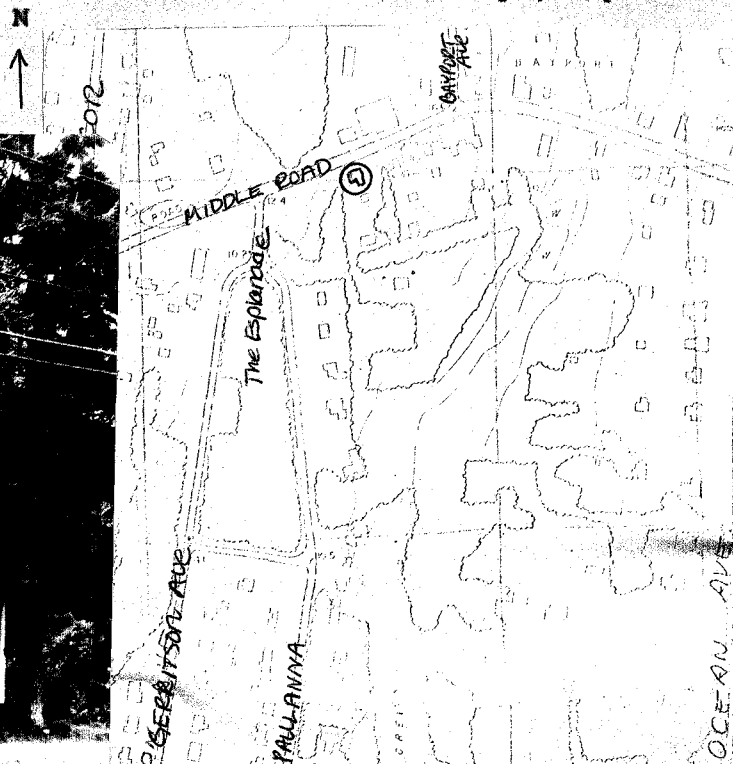

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Two and one-half story, three bay house with gable roof with gable on front. Two pairs of windows on second floor. Original front porch with spandrels and turned posts.

This house is identified as John Wisks' in 1858, and in 1873 with a barn, still extant with matching gable in roof. In 1915, Jno. Morgan owned it and adjoining property which cut across behind Main St., to the creek .
