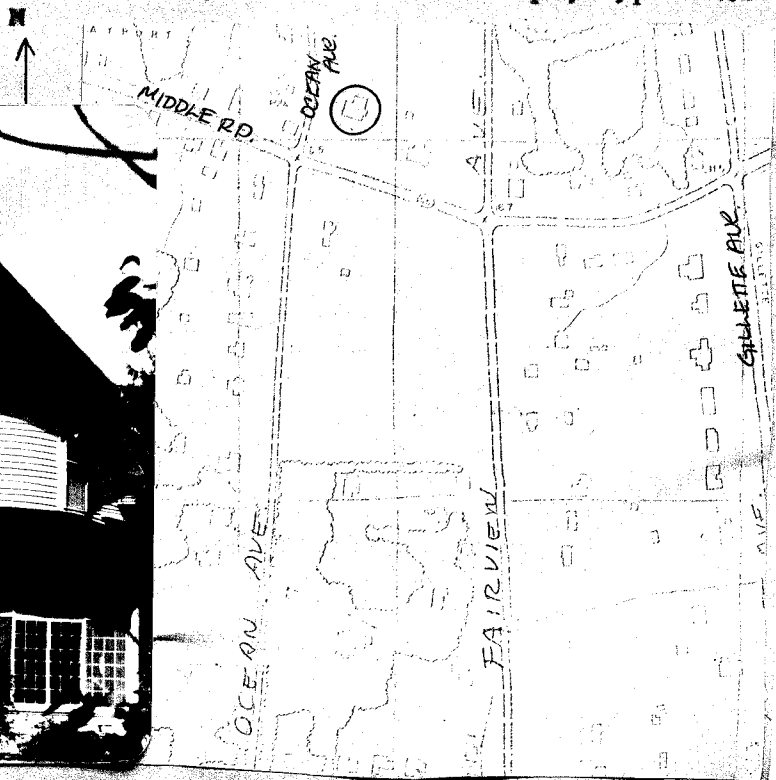

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Large, Queen Anne/Shingle style house with shingled round tower on front. Second floor gallery in large front gable. Eyebrow windows in roof. Ovoid windows on front. Wraparound porch, partly enclosed, with shingled posts. Porte-cochere on west with original brick drive still extant. Very large brick chimney on west, exposed on first floor. Brick foundation. Main section of house has rounded corners on the front, and the porch is rounded to match.

This house has interesting trees surrounding it, including a very large weeping beech in front.

It was owned by Wilson Smith in 1915, AND 1902.
