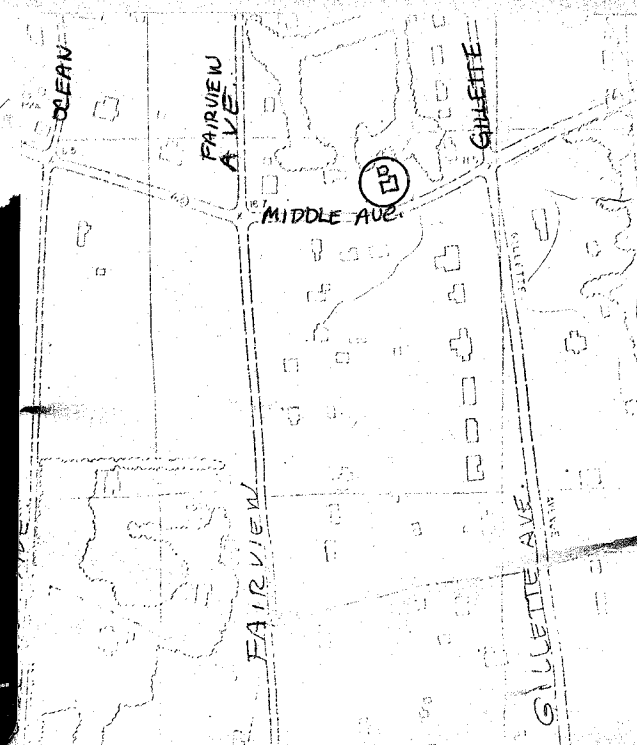

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

One and one-half story, three bay, gable roof house with centered chimney and small windows under the eaves. One story, three bay wing on east with original porch with square posts. Original moulding under cornice on east wing. 6/6 windows; windows on wing have original moulding. Brick foundation. Original square gateposts at front walk and at driveway on east.

This house belonged to Mrs. Gillette in 1915. According to owner of Gillette house next door (BA 46) this was one of the old Gillette farmhouses.
