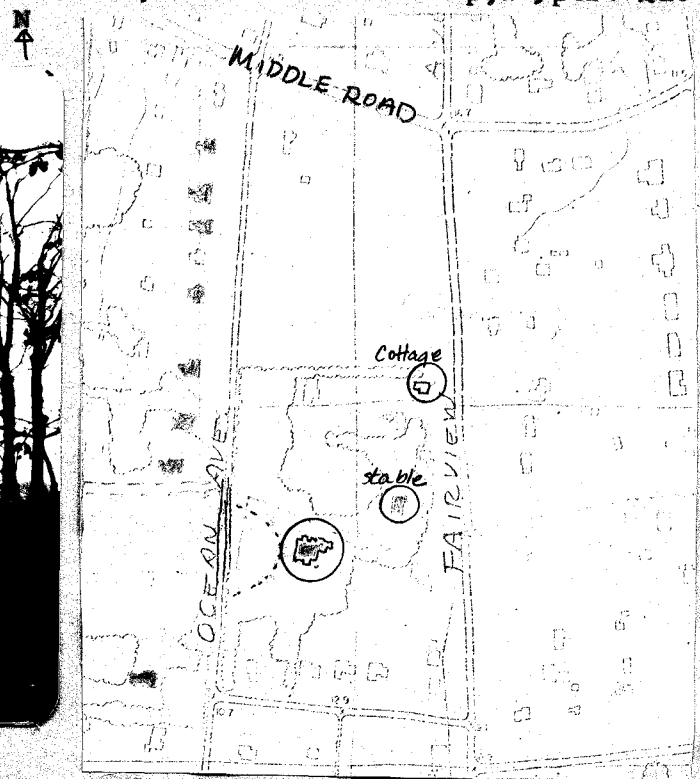

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

Impressive, two and one-half story, three bay, hip roof, colonial revival house with swan neck broken pediment dormer over front center bay, with sunburst decoration over paired windows. Group of four windows over front door with Adamesque swags in window-head. Palladian-style French doors flanking main entrance. Two story, double-decked porches on north and south ends of house. Two matching symmetrical, square, high brick chimneys flanking flat deck on top of roof. Originally a widow walk. See attached photos for early views. See 87A 7 87B for outbuildings.

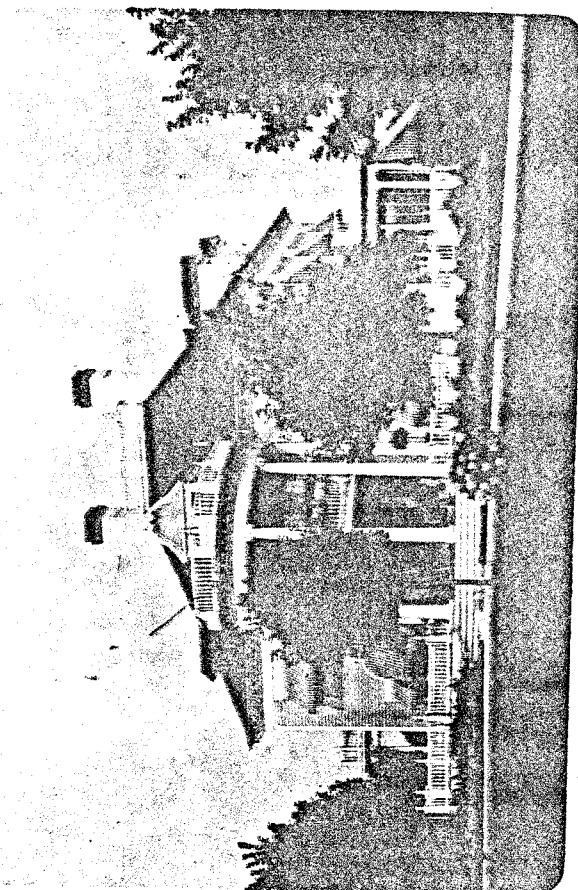
This house was owned by J.H. Stoppani in 1902 and 1915. Later it was owned by the daughter and son-in-law, Judge Marvin Manton on N.Y. Supreme Court.

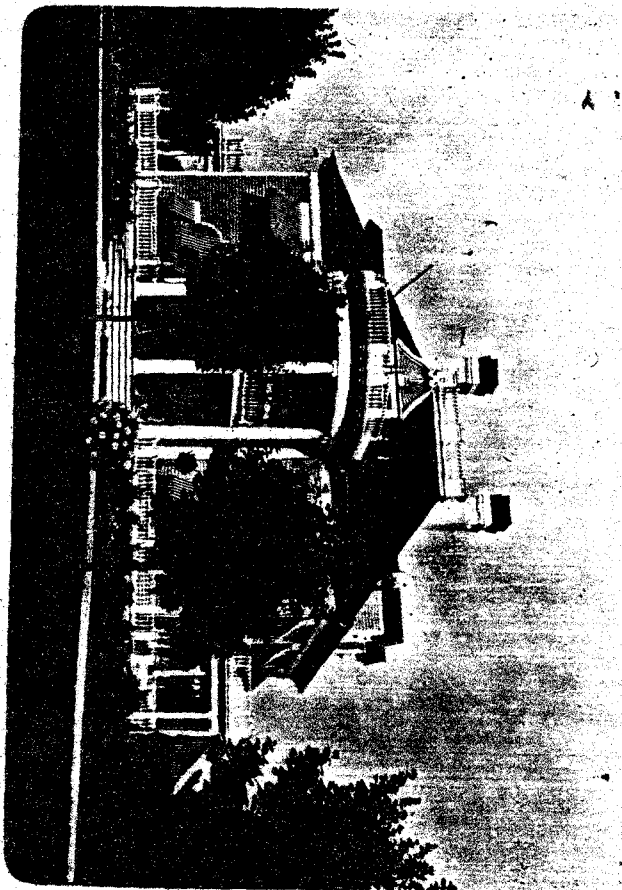

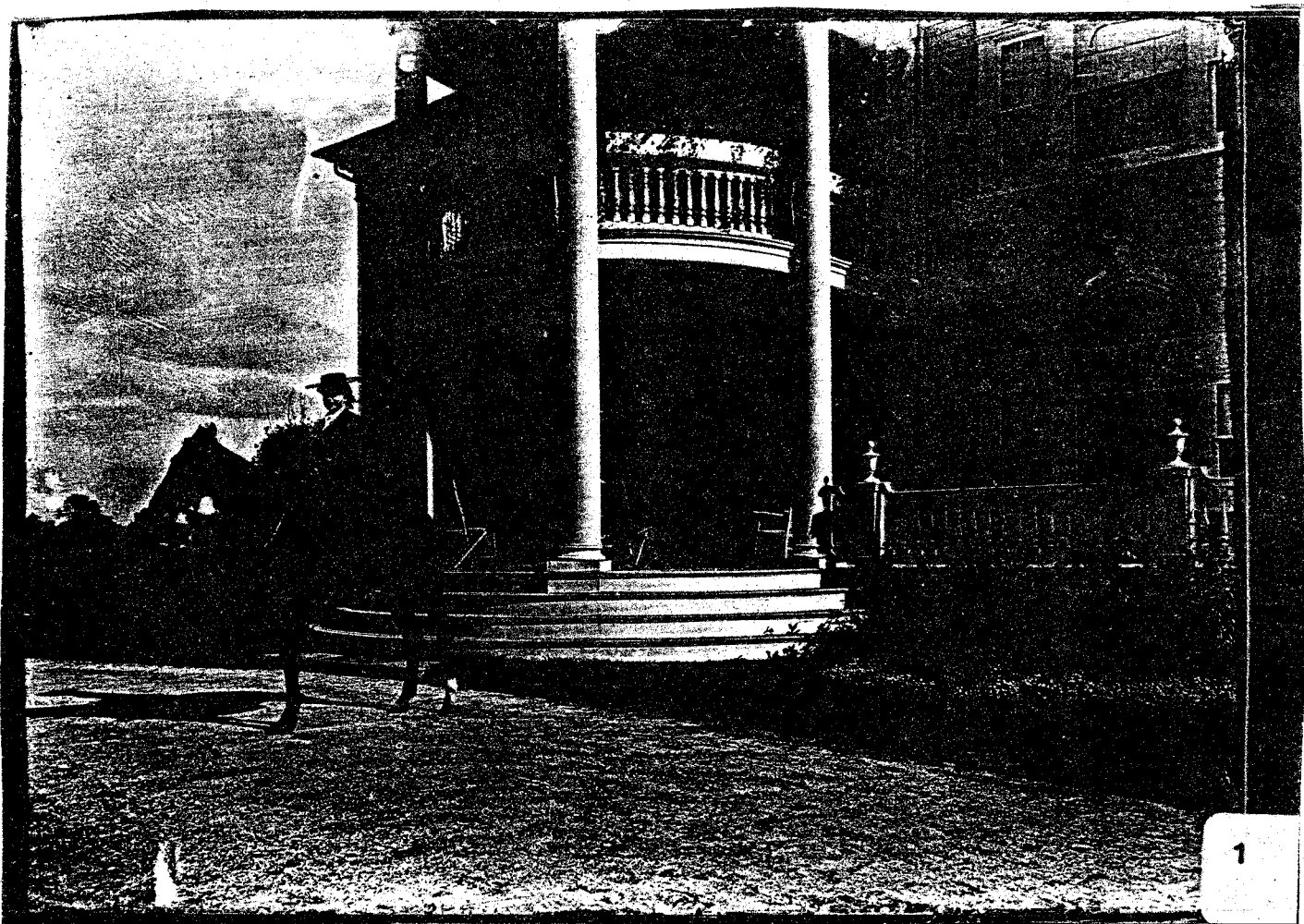
