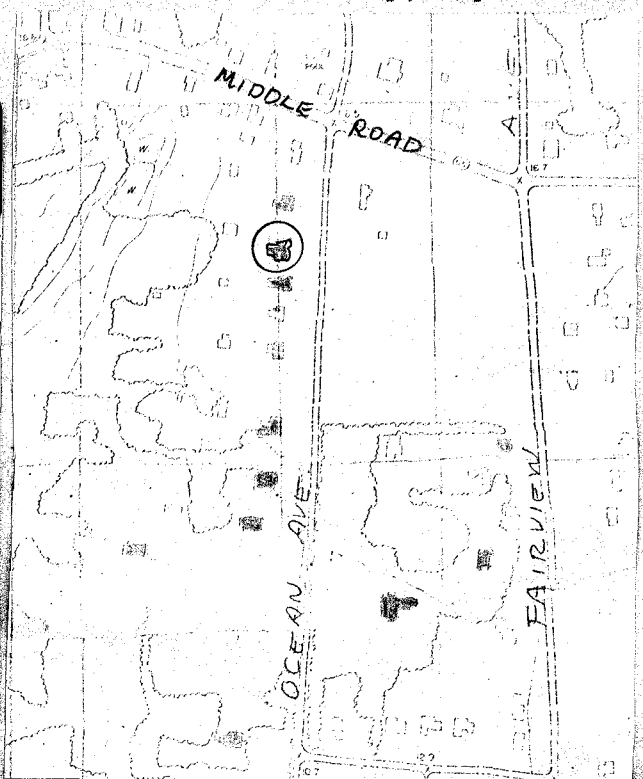
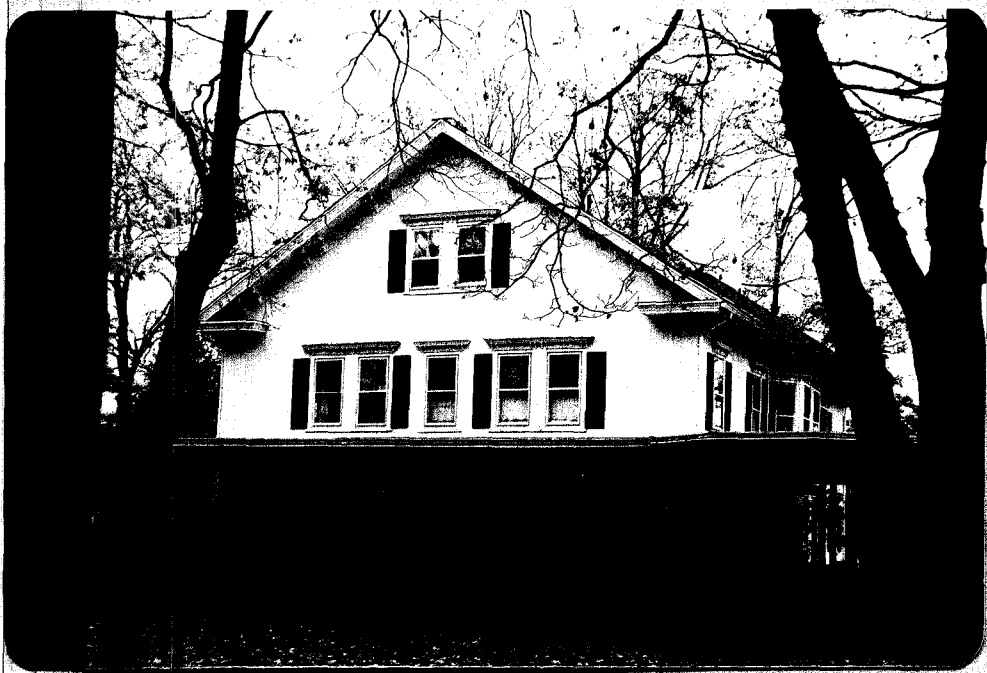

Two and one-half story, five bay, centered entrance, gable roof with gable end to street house. Paired brackets and decorated frieze panels and window heads. Italianate porch with octagonal pavillion at northeast corner. Unusually wide-gabled house using Italianate detail.

Marked on the 1888 map, this house belonged to B. Pielsticker in 1902, and to R. Fitzpatrick in 1915.
