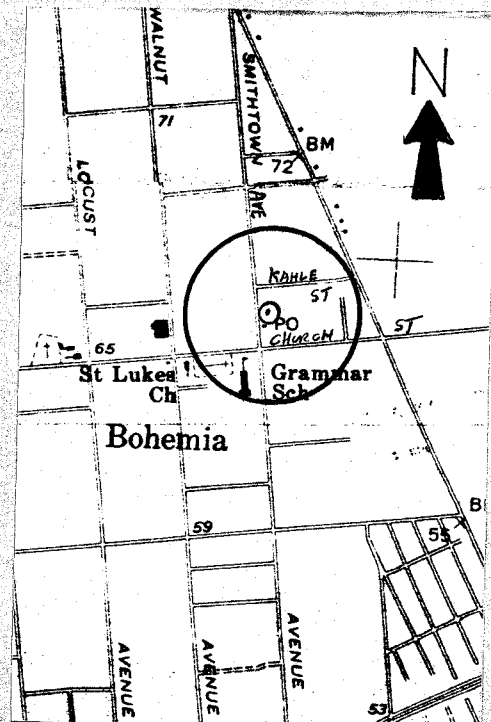

1151 Smithtown Avenue is located on the east side of the street on a treed parcel among residences of similar age and slightly smaller scale. This house is set back from the road more than the surrounding houses.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):
 1151 Smithtown Avenue is a 2½ story, side entrance plan, L-shaped, gable roof house with a porch across the ground story of the principle (west) facade that features turned posts and sawn spandrels. The ell to the south features an overhang above a semi-hexagonal ground story bay window, and scalloped shingles decorate the gable peaks.
