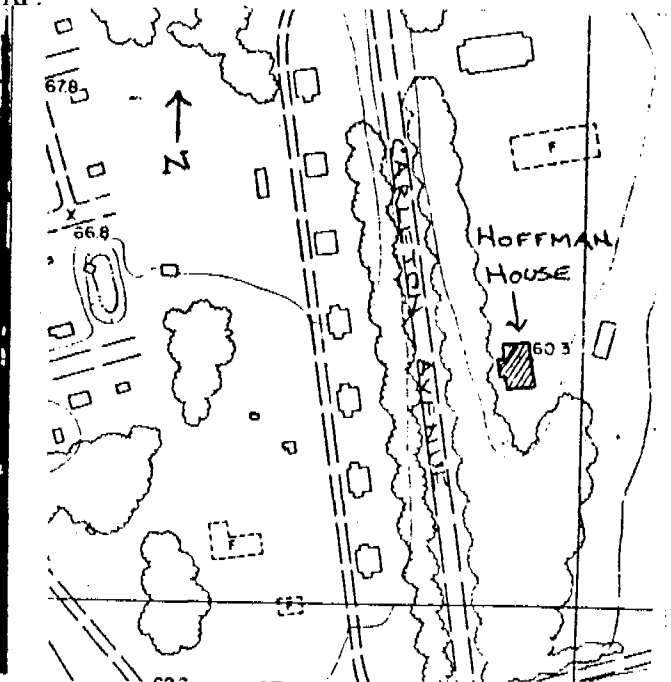

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

Central Islip State Hospital is located on a 1000 acre wooded property. The grounds contain buildings from various periods and in various architectural styles. This building on the main road, Carleton Avenue, is one of several in the Tudor Revival Style.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

There are two gabled bays flanking the center section; the center section has three gabled dormers. At the first story the center section projects, and has a terrace above.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This two and one-half story Tudor Revival building has a brick first story; the second story is stucco with half-timbering. There is a segmental arched front entrance with a transom and flanking windows. The gable windows have diamond-shaped panes; there are drops in the gable peaks. The side eaves have exposed rafter ends. The front dormers have stickwork; there are shed-roofed dormers on the sides. The roof is slate.

The building was completed in 1911 for the staff of the Central Islip State Hospital.
