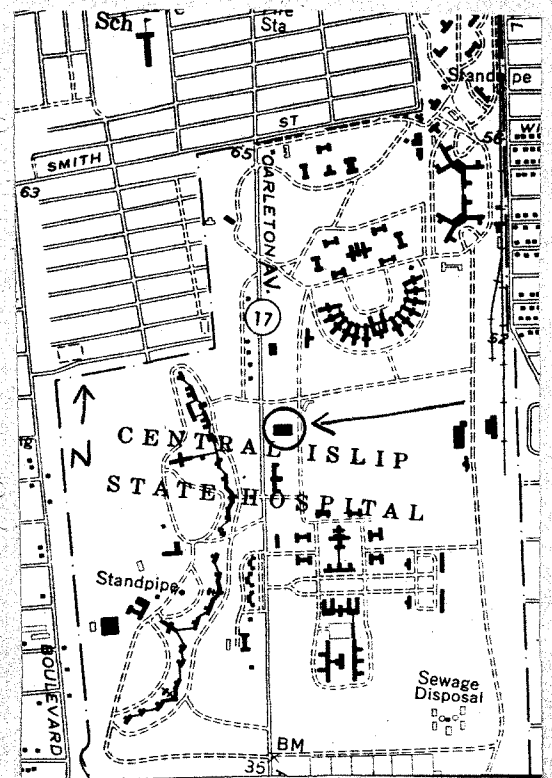

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

The building is a large 2-story, hip roof, auditorium building with giant slightly-projecting, pilastered pediment, 5-bay unit on west (entrance) facade, flanked by 1 story, single bay, flat roof unit containing round topped entrance doors with fan shaped transoms, 3 round headed windows on 1st floor of this facade. Oculus in pediment with high relief scrolled enframement. On north and south facades there are 5 large round headed windows.
