



Each group consists of three attached buildings - a center unit and
two flanking wings with one story connections. The main structures
are two and one-half stories with slate gabled roofs.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:
These three groups of staff cottages are in the English Manor Style;
each consists of three connected wits. The center section's front
entrance projects forward, has a low hip roof, brackets, and a front
door with decorative panelling and glass. The wings have entrances
with triangular-bracketed slate roofed hoods. The doors on the
northern one-story connections have gabled entries with decoratvie
perforations and triangular brackets. There are original six-over-
six windows and bay windows. There are gabled dormers facing the
interior of the units, and shed-roof dormers facing the exterior.
The chimneys are wide and projecting.
