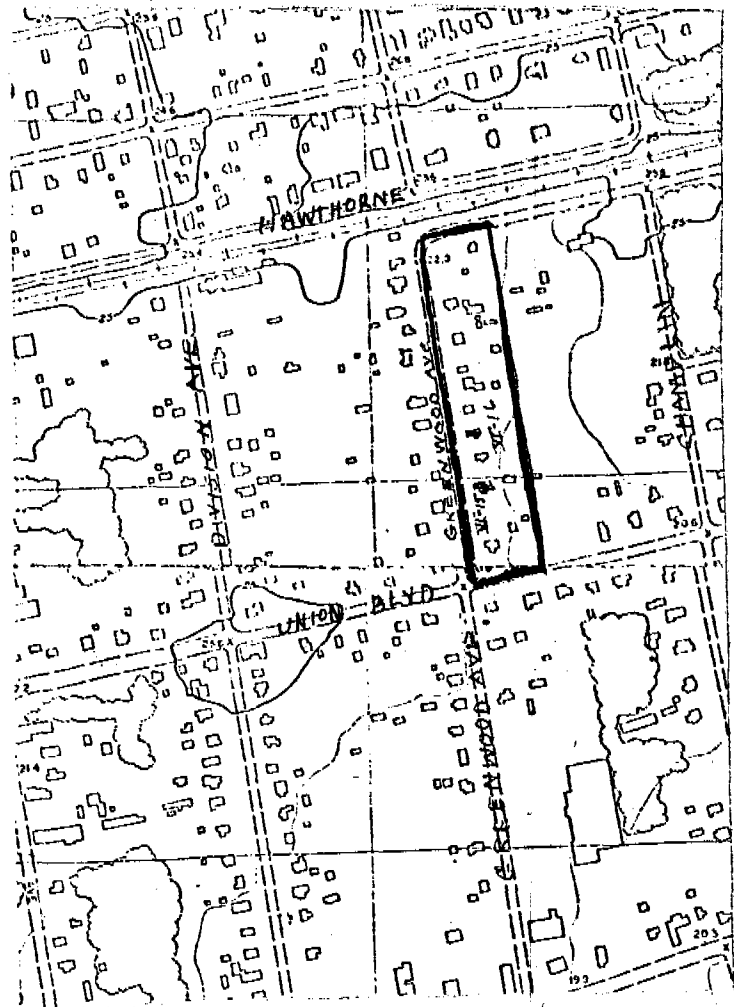
3. DESCRIPTION:

On the east side of Greenwood Avenue, north from Union Boulevard, there is a row of modest houses in the Late Victorian vernacular, all altered except #43 pictured here. #43 is a 1½ story house, gable end to street with clapboards, original porch, colored glass, fishscale shingles in gable, vergeboard and original front door with some colored glass panes.

4. SIGNIFICANCE:

Houses were mostly built by persons who came to Islip from Bohemia. Note names on 1915 map.
