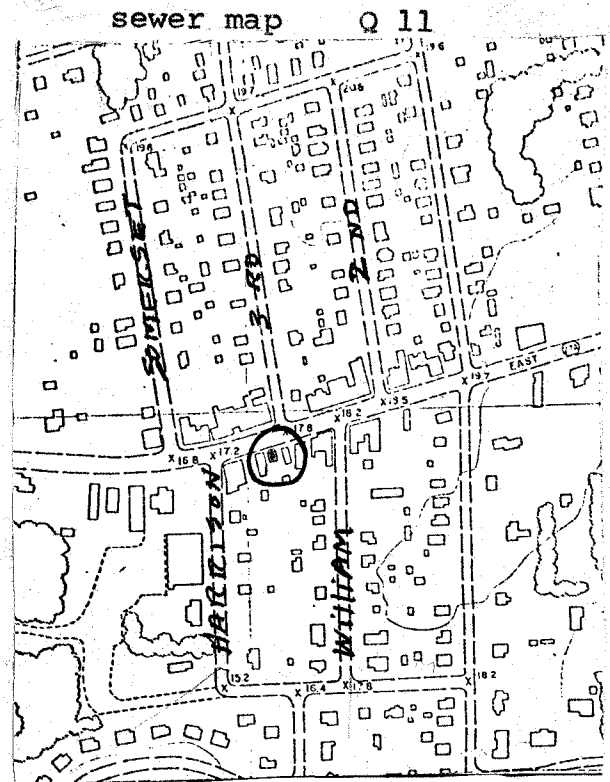

According to present owner, Rudy Tremel, previous owners (in order) were: Rohlicek: butcher shop; Bows: furrier shop; Mrs. Case: Religious gift shop; Present: Rudy Tremel owner since 1956, rents space to wood shop and glassworks; residence on 2nd floor. Rudy Tremel also runs Rudy's, a beauty shop just West of 84 Main St. The oldest surviving storefront in Islip and East Islip.
