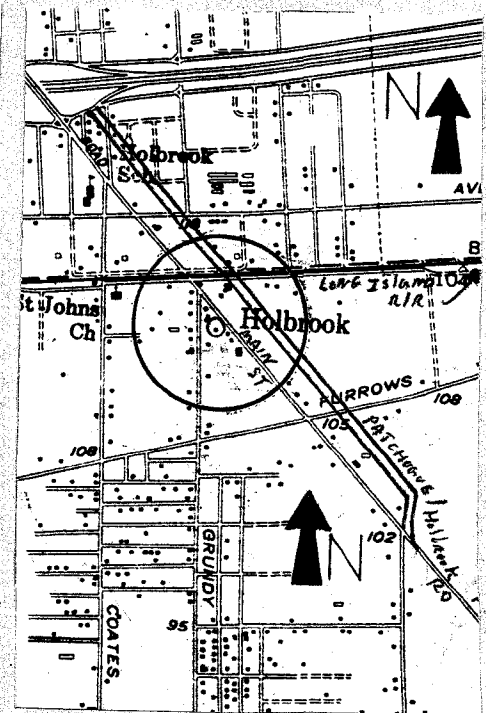
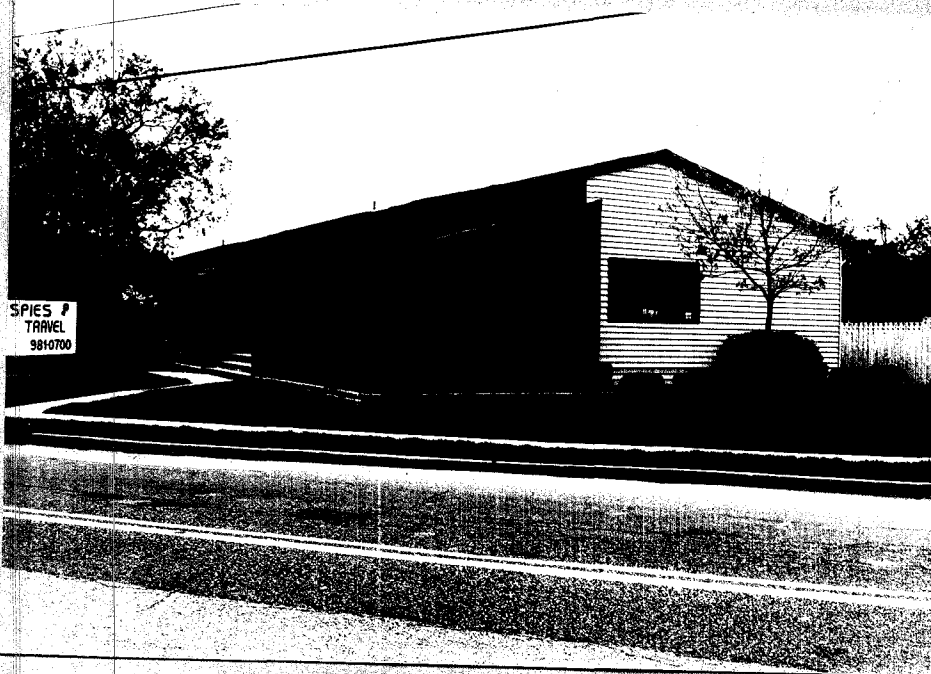

 1022 Main Street is located on the west side of the old Patchogue-Holbrook Road, the present Holbrook Main Street designated after the new expanded Patchogue-Holbrook Road was constructed to the east. It is surrounded by other commercial buildings either renovated from older structures or built as small shopping strips.
18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):  
 1022 Main Street is a rectangular, one story, gable roof building of utilitarian design. The principle facade facing Main Street has been renovated with timber elements and false buttresses.
