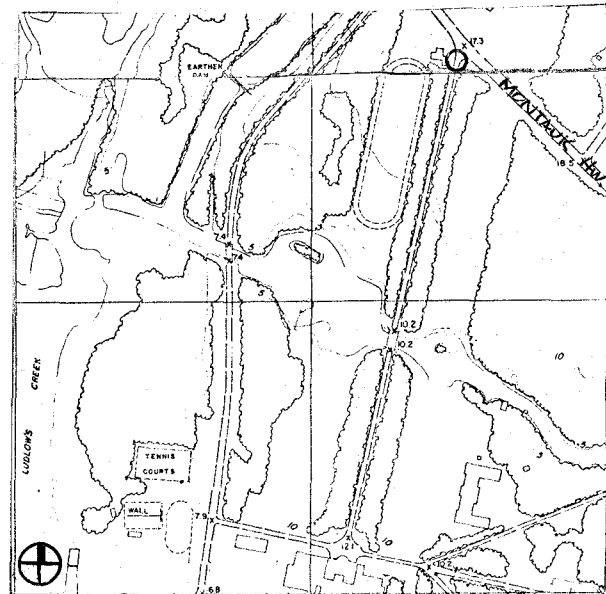

The Bourne Estate Gates and tree-lined drive begin at a point along Montauk Highway, and proceed south to the mansion of the estate, Indian Neck Hall.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):
 High iron gates set into brick piers. Straight, tree-lined driveway with evenly planted spruces and maples. Driveway east of mansion, lined with the same trees, and ends in Y-shape.

The Bourne Main Gates mark the main entrance to the Bourne Estate from Montauk Highway, and are notably distinguished by the structural continuity of the gate wall with the gatelodge wall.
