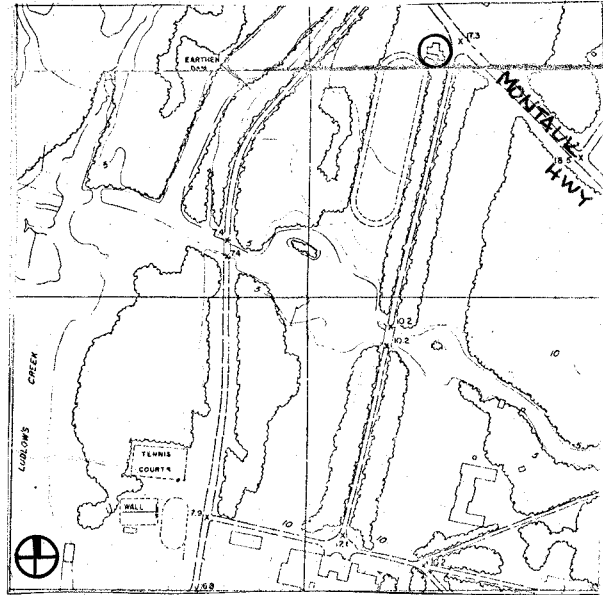

The Bourne Gatehouse marks the main entrance to the Bourne Estate from Montauk Highway, and is notably distinguished by its structural continuity with the gate wall.
