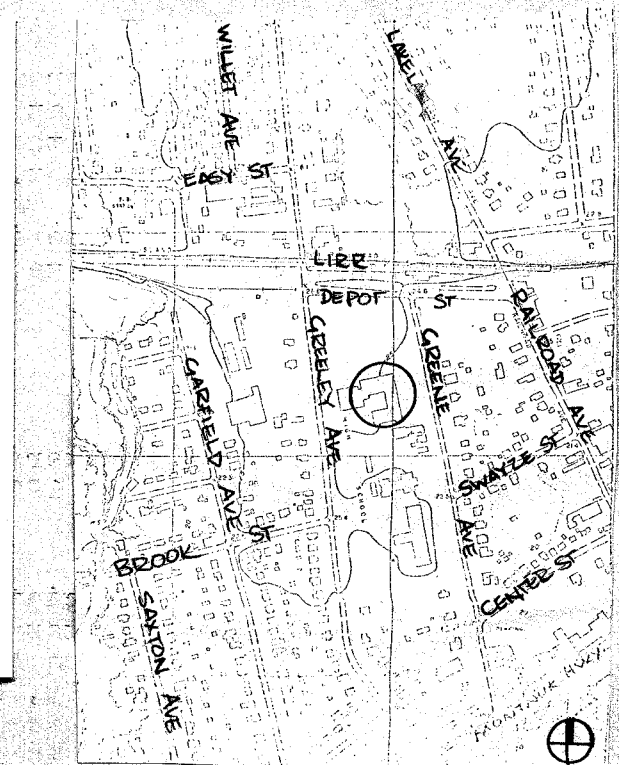

The Sayville Jr. High School is located on the west side of Greene Avenue, north of Main Street (Montauk Hwy.).

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):
 3 story brick building with parapet roof and brick quoins. Slightly projecting central bay with concrete detailing and pedimented entrance bays with giant ionic columns of simulated limestone, also stringcourse, broken pediments at side entrances, and classical ornaments on facade, all of simulated limestone.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:
 The former Junior High School was erected on the site on Greene Avenue in 1928, at a cost of \$338,000. It then served as the high school for the Sayville community. When the present high school on Brook St. in 1958, this building became a junior high, and still later, when the present Jr. High building was erected on Johnson Avenue in 1972, this building was rented to the government operated BOCES.
