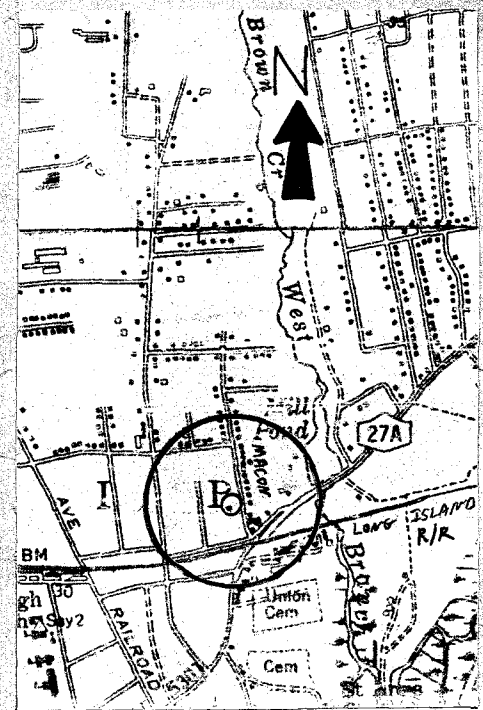

36 Macon Avenue is located on the west side of the street among residences that date from primarily the same period as this house. 36 Macon Avenue retains the most integrity of this varied group.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

36 Macon Avenue is a 1½ story, gable roof, three bay, side entrance plan house set perpendicular to the street. A small shed roof porch covers the entrance bay. A small wing projects from the west (rear) facade. The single bay garage stands to the west of the house. 2/2 windows remain.
