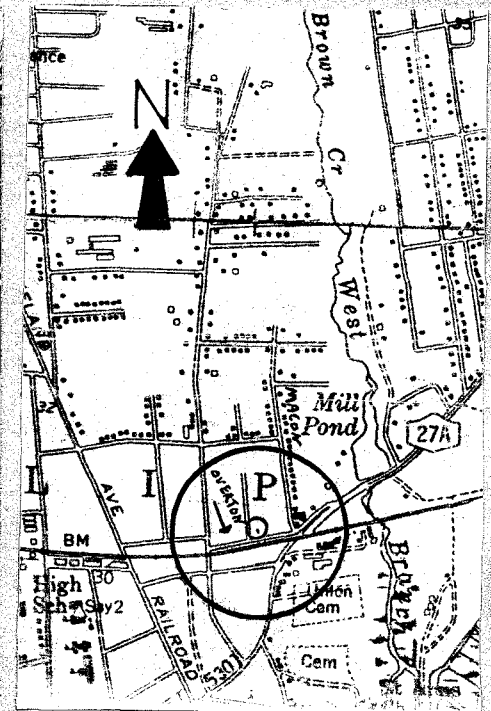

The Overton House is located on the north side of the street next west of SY 5 opposite the Long Island Rail Road tracks near the Montauk Highway overpass. The residences that surround the house date from a mix of historic periods.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The Overton House is a 1½ story, rectangular, five bay, center entrance plan, gable roof house with an interior end chimney and five frieze windows under the eaves of the principle (south) facade. 6/6 sash throughout the house.
