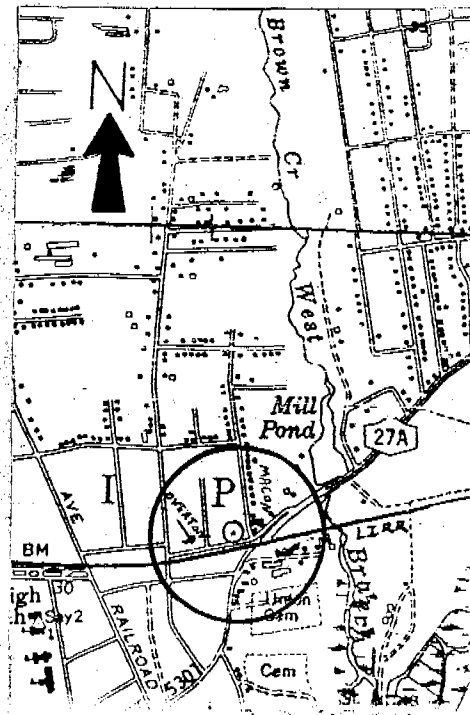

The house is located on the north side of the street that parallels the Long Island Rail Road tracks near the Montauk Highway overpass. A mix of historic residences of varying age surround the house to the west and north.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):

The house is a 1½ story, two bay (paired window), side entrance plan, steep gable roof house set perpendicular to the street with a porch across the principle (south) facade. The gable peak features prominent returns that flank a large central window group with tall middle sash. The peak is shingled around this window feature.
