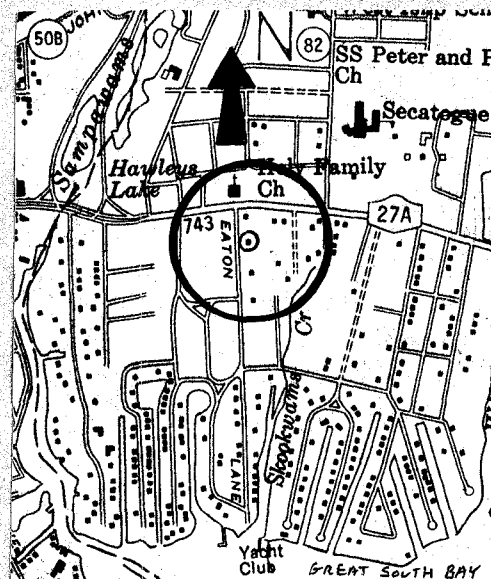

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

 33 Eaton Ln. is the first house south of South Country Rd. on the east side of Eaton Lane. It is located on a wooded lot partially obscured from the road and is surrounded by houses of varying age and size, the newest of which have been built towards the south end of the road near Great South Bay.
18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE (including interior features if known):
 33 Eaton Ln. is a large, 2½ story, four bay, steep gable roof stucco house with a pair of facade gables on the main (west) facade. These contain Tudor Revival style half timber detail. A smaller, 2½ story, single bay, gable roof wing is attached to the north. A one story porch fronts the house, subsumed at the south facade. The house features SIGNIFICANCE several 12/2 window sash.
